## 2017 Preschool Summer Financial Policy/Parental Agreement

**Registration Fee Required:** A registration fee is required to enroll a child (please see current rates enclosed). The registration fee will be refunded only if a child is not accepted by the Academy, otherwise it is considered *non-refundable*.

**Tuition:** Summer rates are weekly rates and are due before the week begins. Failure to pay for the week will result in the student being unable to attend until payment is made. No refunds will be given in the case of illness, absence, holidays, suspension, weather or expulsion.

**Payments:** Payments for tuition and other fees are listed on the tuition rate sheet. Registration fees are due at time of application. Payments will be paid through **FACTS**, a tuition/fee billing and management service **each Friday**.

**Late Fees and Returned Checks:** All accounts are subject to a late fee of \$30.00 if payment is not received on the due date. As a result of a returned check your account will be assessed a charge for the amount of the returned check, as well as a \$35.00 returned check fee.

**Collections and Student Records:** In the event a payment is rejected for any reason, the student will not be allowed to attend the following week. Payment for tuition, fees and other charges will not be allowed in arrears. In case of returned payment, the parent will be notified immediately to make full restitution along with the late payment fee of \$30.00. The student will be terminated for the remaining of the week and all future weeks until the balance is paid in full. There is no proration of weekly tuition rates for attending less than the entire week. The administration reserves the right to refer the account to a collection agency. In the event an account is referred to a collections agency, collection fees in an amount not less than 33% of the delinquent balance shall be added to the account.

**Records:** All student records, including health records, will not be released until the account is paid in full and only after final payment clears the bank if made in the form of a check. All requests must be made in writing and allow a minimum of two full business days for processing.

**Program Changes:** Changes requested in program scheduling must be submitted in writing to the Preschool Director for approval before any changes can be made with the Accountant. Program changes are limited.

**Withdrawals:** Intent to withdraw a student must be made to the Preschool Director in writing and at least two weeks in advance. Failure to do so will result in an additional two weeks of charges reflected on the bill. No exceptions will be made.

**Dismissal:** If a student is permanently dismissed for any reason, parents remain responsible for ensuring payment is made for services rendered while their child was still in attendance.

**Late Pick Up:** If a child is picked up past 6:00 p.m. (12:00 p.m. for half day students) a late fee of \$15.00 will be applied every 10 minutes or fraction thereof. Late fees will be added to the statement at the end of the month.

**Sick Policy:** Any child with a fever of 100° or higher, vomiting, or other serious condition must be picked up by a parent or other authorized individual in a maximum of one and a half hours (1½) from the time the parent is contacted.

**Continual Conflict:** In the event a child, or the parent of a child, continually causes disagreements, conflicts, strife, or arguments, the child shall be dismissed from the school without legal recourse.

**Arbitration:** If a legal issue, disagreement, conflict, problem, injury, injustice, or any other legal dispute should arise between the school, or one of its agents and a child, or parent of a child, we agree, in accordance with the WOLCA Policy and Procedures Manual process for Christian Conciliation, to binding arbitration with a non-partial arbitration party (party to be named in each individual case) for the settling of all issues.

**Legal Fees:** All legal fees, collection fees, attorneys' fees, and any additional fees incurred by the school in an effort to settle disputes connected to this account shall be the sole responsibility of the parent or guardian for which this agreement is made.

**Parental Agreement:** Upon favorable acceptance of the student named above, I hereby agree to accept all rules and regulations of the school and authorize the school to administer such disciplinary measures as may be deemed necessary and proper by the administration. We will pray for our child's educational progress and for the teachers and staff and will give active support to the school program in every way possible, and attend mandatory school functions to which parents are invited. We agree to pay tuition and such fees as are chargeable according to the current schedule of tuition and fees. It is understood that this is an application only and that space will not be reserved for our child until the enrollment process is completed and all fees are paid. I have read and accept the financial policy for tuition fees and refunds. All parents must have an emergency phone number and maintain a working e-mail account which they check regularly as a condition for their child attending Word of Life Christian Academy. It is the parent's responsibility to provide the school with any updates to their e-mail address and emergency telephone contact information if the information provided to the school on the enrollment forms change. It is vital that the school has this current contact information and that the parent is accessible by e-mail so that they can stay informed with important communications pertaining to their child and so that they are readily accessible in the event of an emergency.

**I have read the above financial policy/parental agreement and fully agree to abide by the policy as set forth in its entirety. I understand that this parental agreement and financial policy will be strictly enforced. I agree to pay all financial obligations to Word of Life Christian Academy. I understand that I will have the late fees added to my account if the payment is not made by the due date. # Preschool Discipline Policy

Word of Life Christian Academy believes in discipline that is firm, yet loving. Our objective of discipline is to help your child learn both self-control and expression of their feelings in socially acceptable ways. Students are expected to act in a manner which is conducive to learning and to the smooth functioning of school activities. Word of Life Christian Academy students are expected to respect the rights of their fellow students, to learn to live in a safe and pleasant environment while at school and at school sponsored activities and to respect members of the school staff. Limitations are clearly defined and consistently maintained. If a child does not follow teacher direction or the rules of the school, then disciplinary action will be taken. It is our expectation that the parent will support the school's discipline by administering discipline in the home as needed.

Word of Life Academy does not exercise any form of corporal punishment. Teachers use positive reinforcement—recognition for good behavior, as a means of classroom control. Consequences of inappropriate behavior for preschool students may include the following:

- **Re-direction**—directing the child's attention to other areas of interest to avoid behavior problems.
- **Quiet time**—the child is removed to another area of the classroom away from the other children to refocus on appropriate behavior. Quiet time will be appropriate to the child's age (1 minute per year, i.e. age three, 3 min.).
- **Loss of privileges**—loss of computer time, center time, daily job, etc.
- **Removal from the classroom**—Children who are disruptive during rest time will be brought to the office or to another classroom to complete their rest period. Children are not required to go to sleep but they do have to remain quiet so that others are not disturbed.
- **Office visit**—persistent or severe misbehavior will result in a visit to the office to discuss the problem with the Director.
- **Parent conference**—when the child refuses to change his/her behavior after reasonable attempts have taken place, the teacher or director will request a conference with the parents to discuss the problem and how the parent and teacher can work together to solve the problem. The student may be placed on probation. Progress reports will be sent home to keep the parents informed of the child's progress.

## Behavior and Consequences

Following are examples of offenses and consequences defined by our discipline policy. Using these as a guide, and after considering such factors as the seriousness of the offense, the surrounding circumstances, prior conduct and performance, and teacher recommendations, the Director will determine the appropriate action to be taken.

Offenses: Unacceptable / Inappropriate Behavior
Ignoring a teacher's instructions or redirections.
Disrupting the class (Shouting, Screaming, Throwing tantrums, refusal to be quiet during rest time)
Defiant Behavior. (Refusing to Follow Class Rules or Activities.)
Being unsafe and endangering others. (Throwing toys, blocks or furniture, running away from the teacher)
Aggressive Behavior. (Pushing, Shoving, Kicking, Punching, Pinching, Etc.) Biting— <b>parent notified on 1<sup>st</sup> offense</b>
Destruction of school or student property
Frequent potty-accidents.

## Termination

A student may be terminated from school for a serious breach of conduct, and/or repeated problems with behavior. In the case of such an offense, the matter will be referred to the administrator who will then make a decision as to expulsion. The administrator has the authority to terminate any student for non-compliance with the rules and regulations of the school. Children may also be terminated if they suffer severe separation anxiety or are not fully potty trained.

# Word of Life Christian Academy

## Philosophy

Word of Life Christian Academy (WOLCA) is a ministry of Word of Life Assembly of God Church. As a ministry of the church, WOLCA will support the vision, goals, and objectives of the Church. This means that WOLCA, its employees, faculty, staff, and student body will operate in full harmony with the ministry and programs of the Church. Facilities will be shared equitably between the Church and all its affiliated ministries. This includes the principle of shared usage and accountability for all Word of Life Church assets and property. All assets, to include property and supplies are owned and administered by Word of Life Assembly of God Church. This philosophy of shared values between WOLCA and the Church and the philosophy that WOLCA is a ministry of the Church is the guiding principle, which shall direct and influence all business and academic decisions relating to the operation of WOLCA.

The educational philosophy of WOLCA is based on a God-centered view that all truth is God's truth, and that the Bible is the inspired and infallible authoritative Word of God, which contains this truth. Our aim is to provide a Christian perspective on the total worldview. The philosophy ensures a balanced personality and a proper understanding and acceptance of a person's role in life at home, at work, at play and at worship, all grounded in Christian principles.

This philosophy channels our energies to promote high academic standards while helping the students to achieve skills in creative and critical thinking using the best integrated curriculum available. The objective of our instructional program is to enable the student to pursue the post-secondary education of their choosing, whether in college, university or in vocational training areas.

The Academy's responsibility to the student encompasses the spiritual, mental, intellectual, physical, social and emotional areas. Therefore, our aim is to teach spiritual values in all areas of curriculum. Spiritual values are woven throughout the total curriculum. All activities we employ or permit in the classroom or school program will either facilitate or reinforce this Christian education philosophy. The spiritual must permeate all areas, lest we become textbook oriented rather than student oriented.

This philosophy dictates that we cooperate closely with parents in every phase of the student's development, always offering assistance in understanding the purpose of WOLCA.

Certain objectives are established in order to implement this philosophy.

To teach that the Bible is the inspired and the only infallible authoritative Word of God, thus developing attitudes of love and respect toward it (II Timothy 3:15-17; II Peter 1:20-21).

To provide opportunities for the student to confess Christ as Savior and Lord (Romans 10:9-10).

To teach Biblical character qualities and provide opportunities for the student to demonstrate these qualities (I Samuel 16:7; Galatians 5:22-23).

To teach the students how to develop the mind of Christ towards godliness (Philippians. 2:5; I Timothy. 4:7)

To encourage the student to develop self-discipline and responsibility from God's perspective (I Timothy 4:7; I Corinthians 9:24-27).

To teach the student the respect for and submission to authority from God's perspective (Romans 13:1-7; Hebrews 13:17; Ephesians 6:1-3).

To help the student develop a Christian worldview by integrating life, and all studies, with the Bible (II Peter 1:3).

To teach the student to hide God's Word in his heart through memorization and meditation (Psalms 119:11; Psalms 1:1-3)

To help the student develop his identity in Christ as a unique individual created in the image of God and to attain his fullest potential (Psalms 139:13-16).

To teach the student to treat everyone with love and respect as unique individuals created in God's image (Philippians 2:1-4; Ephesians 5:21).

To teach the student how to become a contributing member of his society by realizing his need to serve others (Galatians 5:13; Romans 2:10).

To teach the student physical fitness, good health habits, and wise use of the body as the temple of God (I Corinthians 6:19-20).

To teach the student Biblical attitudes toward material things and his responsibility for using them to God's glory (I Timothy 6:17-19; Matthew 6:19-20; I Corinthians 10: 31).

To teach the student to understand and use fundamental processes in communicating and dealing with others [such as reading, writing, speaking, listening, and mathematics] (II Corinthians 5:20).

To teach and encourage the student to use good study skills and habits (II Timothy 2:3-7).

To teach the student how to research and to reason logically from a Biblical perspective (Hebrews 5:14; Romans 12:2).

To teach the student good citizenship through an understanding and appreciation of our Christian and American heritage's [home, church, and nation] (I Corinthians 10:11; Romans 13:1-7).

To cooperate closely with the parents in every phase of the student's development, especially as it relates to the school program (Mark 10:45).

To help the parents to understand the school's purpose and program.

To encourage parents to realize and shoulder their responsibility for the spiritual, moral, and social education of their children (Deuteronomy 6:4-7, Proverbs 22:6).

This Philosophy of Christian Education for WOLCA shall be the guiding tool for applying Biblical principles to teaching practices. Any use of materials or practices inconsistent with this Philosophy of Christian Education will not be permitted. The Board shall apply this Philosophy of Christian Education in all Board meetings. All WOLCA faculty and staff members shall apply this Philosophy of Christian Education in their daily work for WOLCA. Employees shall be committed to fulfilling the principles outlined in the Philosophy of Christian Education in every reasonable way possible. Unwillingness to adopt and promote these basic Christian education principles is grounds for dismissal.

## Statement of Faith

Word of Life Christian Academy (WOLCA) is a ministry of Word of Life Assembly of God Church (WOLAG). The Statement of Faith for both WOLCA and the Church is recorded in the Constitution and Bylaws of Word of Life Assembly of God Church, Springfield, VA.

**The Scriptures Inspired.** The Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, are verbally inspired of God and are the revelation of God to man, the infallible, authoritative rule of faith and conduct (II Timothy 3:15-17; I Thessalonians 2:13; II Peter 1:21).

**The One True God.** The one true God has revealed Himself as the eternally self-existent “I AM,” the Creator of heaven and earth and the Redeemer of mankind. He has further revealed Himself as embodying the principles of relationship and association as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost (Deuteronomy 6:4; Isaiah 43:10, 11; Matthew 28:19; Luke 3:22).

**The Deity of the Lord Jesus Christ.** The Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God. The Scriptures declare:

His virgin birth (Matthew 1:23; Luke 1:31-35).

His sinless life (Hebrews 7:26; I Peter 2:22).

His miracles (Acts 2:22; 10:38).

His substitutionary work on the cross (I Corinthians 15:3;

II Corinthians 5:21).

His bodily resurrection from the dead (Matthew 28:6; Luke 24:39; I Corinthians 15:4).

His exaltation to the right hand of God (Acts 1:9, 11; 2:33; Philippians 2:9-11; Hebrews 1:3).

**The Fall of Man.** Man was created good and upright; for God said, “*Let us make man in our image, after our likeness.*” However, man by voluntary transgression fell and thereby incurred not only physical death but also spiritual death, which is separation from God (Genesis 1:26, 27; 2:17; 3:6; Romans 5:12-19).

**The Salvation of Man.** Man’s only hope of redemption is through the shed blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

Conditions of Salvation: Salvation is received through repentance toward God and faith toward the Lord Jesus Christ. By the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Ghost, being justified by grace through faith, man becomes an heir of God according to the hope of eternal life (Luke 24:47; John 3:3; Romans 10:13-15; Ephesians 2:8; Titus 2:11; 3:5-7).

The Evidence of Salvation: The inward evidence of salvation is the direct witness of the Spirit (Romans 8:16). The outward evidence to all men is a life of righteousness and true holiness (Ephesians 4:24; Titus 2:12).

### **The Ordinances of the Church.**

**Baptism in Water:** The ordinance of baptism by immersion is commanded in the Scriptures. All who repent and believe on Christ as Savior and Lord are to be baptized. Thus they declare to the world that they have died with Christ and that they also have been raised with Him to walk in newness of life (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:16; Acts 10:47-48; Romans 6:4).

**Holy Communion:** The Lord’s Supper, consisting of the elements—bread and the fruit of the vine—is the symbol expressing our sharing the divine nature of our Lord Jesus Christ (II Peter 1:4); a memorial of His suffering and death (I Corinthians 11:26); and a prophecy of His second coming (I Corinthians 11:26); and is enjoined on all believers “till He come!”

**The Baptism in the Holy Ghost.** All believers are entitled to and should ardently expect and earnestly seek the promise of the Father, the baptism in the Holy Ghost and fire, according to the command of our Lord Jesus Christ. This was the normal experience of all in the early Christian Church. With it comes the endowment of power for life and service, the bestowment of the gifts and their uses in the work of the ministry (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4, 8; I Corinthians 12:1-31). This experience is distinct from and subsequent to the experience of the new birth (Acts 8:12-17; 10:44-46; 15:7-9). With the baptism in the Holy Ghost come such experiences as an overflowing fullness of the Spirit (John 7:37-39; Acts 4:8), a deepened reverence for God (Acts 2:43; Hebrews 12:28), an intensified consecration to God and dedication to His work (Acts 2:42), and a more active love for Christ, for His Word, and for the lost (Mark 16:20).

**The Evidence of the Baptism in the Holy Ghost.** The baptism of believers in the Holy Ghost is witnessed by the initial physical sign of speaking with other tongues as the Spirit of God gives utterance (Acts 2:4). The speaking in tongues in this instance is the same in essence as the gift of tongues (I Corinthians 12:4-10, 28), but different in purpose and use.

**Sanctification.** Sanctification is an act of separation from that which is evil, and of dedication unto God (Romans 12:1-2; I Thessalonians 5:23; Hebrews 13:12). The Scriptures teach a life of “*holiness without which no man shall see the Lord*” (Hebrews 12:14). By the power of the Holy Ghost we are able to obey the command: “*Be ye holy, for I am holy*” (I Peter 1:15-16).

**The Church and Its Mission.** The Church is the Body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine appointments for the fulfillment of her great commission. Each believer, born of the Spirit, is an integral part of the General Assembly and Church of the Firstborn, which are written in heaven (Ephesians 1:22-23; 2:22; Hebrews 12:23). Since God’s purpose concerning man is to



seek and to save that which is lost, to be worshipped by man, and to build a body of believers in the image of His Son, the priority reason-for-being of the Assemblies of God as part of the Church is:

To be an agency of God for evangelizing the world (Acts 1:8; Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16).

To be a corporate body in which man may worship God (I Corinthians 12:13).

To be a channel of God's purpose to build a body of saints being perfected in the image of His Son (Ephesians 4:11-16; I Corinthians 12:28; 13:12).

The Assemblies of God exists expressly to give continuing emphasis to this reason-for-being in the New Testament apostolic pattern by teaching and encouraging believers to be baptized in the Holy Spirit. This experience enables them to evangelize in the power of the Spirit with accompanying supernatural signs (Mark 16:15-20; Acts 4:29-31; Hebrews 2:3-4).

Adds a necessary dimension to worshipful relationship with God (I Corinthians 2:10-16; 12:13-14).

Enables them to respond to the full working of the Holy Spirit in expression of fruit and gifts and ministries as in New Testament times for the edifying of the body of Christ (Galatians 5:22-26; I Corinthians 14:12; Ephesians 4:11, 12; I Corinthians 12:28; Colossians 1:29).

**The Ministry.** A divinely called and scripturally ordained ministry has been provided by our Lord for the threefold purpose of leading the Church in:

Evangelization of the world (Mark 16:15-20).

Worship of God (John 4:23-24).

Building a body of saints being perfected in the image of His Son (Ephesians 4:11-16).

**Divine Healing.** Divine healing is an integral part of the gospel. Deliverance from sickness is provided for in the atonement, and is the privilege of all believers (Isaiah 52:4-5; Matthew 8:16-17; James 5:14-16).

**The Blessed Hope.** The resurrection of those who have fallen asleep in Christ and their translation together with those who are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord is the imminent and blessed hope of the Church (I Thessalonians 4:16-17; Romans 8:23; Titus 2:13; I Corinthians 15:51-52).

**The Millennial Reign of Christ.** The second coming of Christ includes the rapture of the saints, which is our blessed hope, followed by the visible return of Christ with His saints to reign on the earth for one thousands years (Zechariah 14:5; Matthew 24:27, 30; Revelation 1:7; 19:11-14; 20:1-6). This millennial reign will bring the salvation of national Israel (Ezekiel 37:21-22; Zephaniah 3:19-20; Romans 11:26-27) and the establishment of universal peace (Isaiah 11:6-9; Psalms 72:3-8; Micah 4:3-4).

**The Final Judgment.** There will be a final judgment in which the wicked dead will be raised and judged according to their works. Whosoever is not found written in the Book of Life, together with the devil and his angels, the beast and the false prophet, will be consigned to everlasting punishment in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone, which is the second death (Matthew 25:46; Mark 9:43-48; Revelation 19:20; 20:11-15; 21:8).

**The New Heavens and the New Earth.** *"We, according to His promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness"* (II Peter 3:13; Revelation 21, 22).

We recognize that certain teachings are left primarily to other Church ministries and the home.

Open opposition to these basic Christian Statements of Faith is grounds for dismissal.

I understand that if a child in my program requires prescription medication to be administered rectally, vaginally, by injection or by another route not listed above, I will follow the procedures outlined in the MAT training for children with special health care needs.

I understand that to be approved to administer prescription medication, all individuals listed in my *PROGRAM'S DECISION REGARDING MEDICATION* plan (unless the individual is licensed to administer prescription medications) must have a valid:

- Medication Administration Training (MAT) certificate;
- CPR certificate which covers all ages of the children my program is approved to care for as listed on my registration/license; and
- First aid certificate which covers all ages of children my program is approved to care for as listed on my registration/license.
